

The line up down the main drag when we went to leave was over two miles long of bike parking. Given the number of people and bikes, the crowds were truly well-behaved. The police presence was very evident and they kept the traffic flowing well...and the H.A. "aware" that they were there!

We were grateful for the beach on the Lake Erie shore to go for a quick dip as the heat and humidity was something outside the comfort zone for these Manitobans. Even with the heat, we all had a great time walking amongst the vendors, enjoying a beer while watching a band, eating some Lake Erie perch, and just people watching. We even caught a look at some nice vintage bikes amongst the throng of cruisers and rockets.

Editor/Publisher Dave handed out the May/June Newsletter.

The Fort La Reine Event was rained out but 6 hardy soaked souls still went anyway. This was scheduled to become an annual breakfast ride and a date would be set for next year that does not clash with other events. Bikers are a tough lot!

The Niverville Pre-Rally Fair Parade was also rained out and was cancelled at the last minute. Again no less than 9 hardy club members did the parade on their own anyway, with Greg O'K leading as usual showing the club banner.

Up-coming event on the horizon was Morden's Corn & Apple Harley Show & Shine. Sponsored by Rudy of Gaslight Harley this will take place on Sunday, August 26th in Morden Park. There will be one lone BSA amongst the many hostile hogs that I know of, because it will be mine!

The 36th Annual Corn Roast will take place at the usual venue on Saturday, August 25th.

Greg K is working hard on the regular Pony Coral get-togethers and is hoping to get a featured night there for our club.

Members were reminded to check our Web Site at amcm.ca and Webmaster Big Greg received a well -deserved round of applause for his outstanding work on a web site of which we can be proud.

Chas reported on another bumper Perimeteritis with a record number of 41 bikes out and 83 sitting down to the hamburger supper. After expenses \$131 was handed to the treasurer for club funds.

Last minute Rally discussion was chaired by Chas and all systems were GO for the 12th Bison Rally.

Rusted Restorations was also handled by Chas who recounted a remarkable story which happened in the early 70's. On his trusty 1964 R60/2 BMW (600cc) with sidecar loaded with his two little girls and wife Viola on the back, old canvas tent with wooden pole, plus bedding, clothes and all camping gear, they undertook a lengthy road trip. After many miles the BMW engine seized and Chas, with the help of a hastily purchased file, fitted rings from an industrial Kohler engine! After numerous other problems they eventually got home on one cylinder! Chas still has that motorcycle. What an amazing tail of ingenuity and innovation in another era when motorcycling was very different from what it is today!

MINUTES OF JULY MEETING 31/07/2012 at HD Winnipeg

Present 38 members and 1 guest. President Ross welcomed all to the meeting especially the guest.

President Ross reported on the Jim Simmons funeral and asked for a moments silence in respect for our founder member. 15 members had ridden their bikes to the funeral home. & Ross conveyed a message of appreciation to the club from Jim's wife.

A motion to donate \$100 from club funds to Cancer Care was proposed, seconded & carried unanimously. Treasurer Greg undertook to send the cheque.

Jim Harrison announced that he had officially retired and was promptly asked if we would now see him on his Ariel SQ 4 at the Corn Roast, given the fact that 90% of the members had never seen it!

Treasurer Greg presented the financial report :----Bank balance as at meeting date \$5942.44 A separate Rally balance sheet was presented showing that the rally profit was \$1646.46 There had been 89 pre-registrations for the full 3 days (Of which 9 were no-shows)29 had registered for Saturday only, and 6 for Friday only. 126 sat down to the dinner on Saturday evening. 5 new members joined at the rally.

Librarian Mike (the book) displayed some very nice new additional books to our library, and the usual 50/50 was run by him later.

President Ross proposed adding a new bi-monthly feature to our meetings. It would be called "Who Am I ?" & would take the form of members providing old photographs of themselves with their motorcycles to Editor Dave P. Dave will publish them in the newsletter and at the meeting after the newsletter comes out members will be asked to guess who it is. Members were asked to start looking for old photos and getting them to Dave right away.

A motion was proposed and motivated by Greg O'Kane that "the AMCM adopt the Spina Bifida and Hydrocephalus Association of Manitoba as our clubs official charitable organization" This motion was seconded and carried unanimously by a show of hands. Greg further proposed that the annual "Gimli Fishing Trip," up to now undertaken by some club members and friends, be officially adopted as an Annual Club Ride to generate voluntary funds for Spina Bifida. This would take the form of riders collecting sponsorship monies, and official SB&H sponsorship forms were handed out. All donations of \$20 or more will qualify for a tax receipt. The date for this years Gimli Fishing Trip was set at Saturday August 25. Big Greg would be asked to put this on our Web Site.

Rally Chair Chas then took the floor for the Rally Post Mortem. A rally de-briefing meeting had taken place earlier and Chas reported on points brought up there. Chas opened by thanking all who had worked so tirelessly for many months to make this years rally the success that it was, and a round of applause was the response from the floor. Chas then asked for any comments or constructive criticism from the floor and a lively discussion followed with many very valid points raised. Too many to be tabulated here, but duly noted for next years rally. Chas had booked already with Niverville for next year. After lengthy discussion it was agreed that the Feature Marque for 2013 would be "The Year of the Norton"

Discussion took place on whether AMCM Club Regalia should be sold to non club people, or to members only. Opinions were sharply divided on this issue and President Ross made a decision to let members consider the pros & cons of this issue for a month. It would be on the next meetings agenda when a show of hands would be called for to decide one way or the other.

Chas proposed that an amount of \$200 be put aside from Rally profits each year to purchase a park bench with suitably enscribed plaque to be donated to the Town of Niverville for their proposed Splash Park project. This would be retrospect to last years rally so an amount of \$400 was now available after the 2012 rally. This motion was seconded and carried.

One point raised by Barry Smith was that more younger rally volunteers were needed. Tom grasped this opportunity to announce that he would be stepping down from the rally committee for 2013. His excuse was that he was getting too old and called for a younger person with computer skills to volunteer and to help Chas next year.

There was further discussion on the Vintage Plate with no further news since the meeting Ross and Parker Fillmore had with the authorities.

"Rusted Restorations" was covered when Dennis Robidoux took the floor to recount the story surrounding his lovely prize-winning 1938 Indian Chief. Many of us were surprised to learn of the bikes history and origins originated with our very club.

The "Mystery Part" was AGAIN guessed correctly as being a Harley Davidson front sprocket for a belt drive, albeit with no teeth left on the centre splines.

The usual adjourned to Robins for coffee.
