





Members were asked to bring up to two motorcycle-related items for auction by our in-house auctioneer Jim Mitchell from Manitou. He would auction off items brought with half the proceeds going to the member and half to club funds.

Greg Kendall gave details of the December 10 Christmas Party/Dinner.

Movie Night 2014 was set for January 28th, 2014 at Ross M 's home in Headingly.

Rusted Restorations saw Billy Watt and his life-long friend Joe Sawdus take the floor and give one of the most interesting talks of motorcycling in the 50's, yet. The now extinct Rough Riders Motorcycle Club, MMC, Joe's racing successes, World War Two stories and their motorcycling escapades from a long-gone era, kept us enthralled.
