Bert Bentley gave us a lot of books including a 1938 Harley-Davidson Spare Parts Catalogue, Harley-Davidson Riders Handbook, Question and Answers- 18th edition, a 1952 A.J.S. 500cc SpringTwin Spares List, 1946-49 Norton spare parts list, and 1949-51 Norton Spare Parts LIST .Len Hardy added the 1950 and 1955 Northwest Cycle and Motor Co.
