



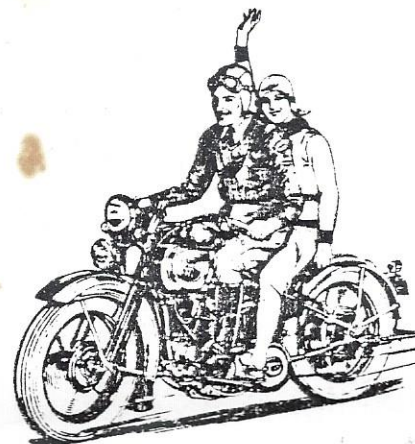

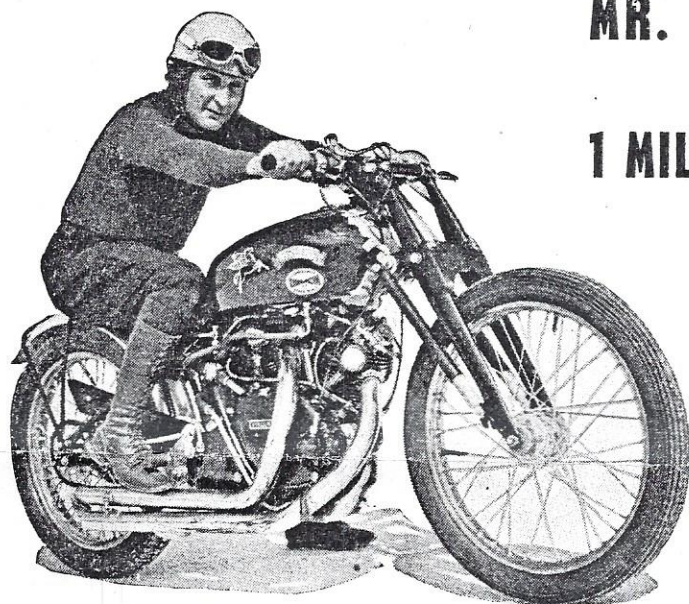

DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

WE, the Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, do hereby declare that these United States are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States; that they are absolved from all political connection with Great Britain; that all political connection between them and that Kingdom is hereby totally dissolved; that all the laws made by the Parliament of Great Britain, bearing date prior to the separation of these United States from that Kingdom, are hereby declared null and void; that the United States of America are now, and of right ought to be, a free and independent State; that they have full power to levy war, conclude peace, contract alliances, enter into commerce, and do all other acts which independent States may do.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and seals, this fourth day of July, 1776.

JOHN ADAMS, President of the Continental Congress.
JOHN JAY, Secretary of the Continental Congress.
