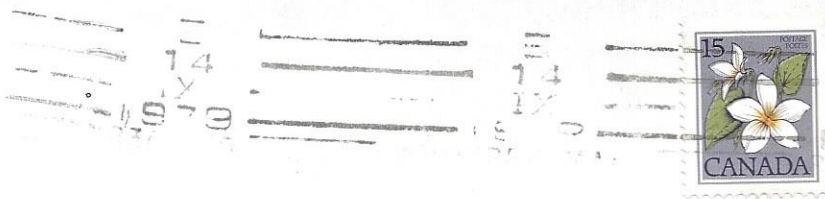
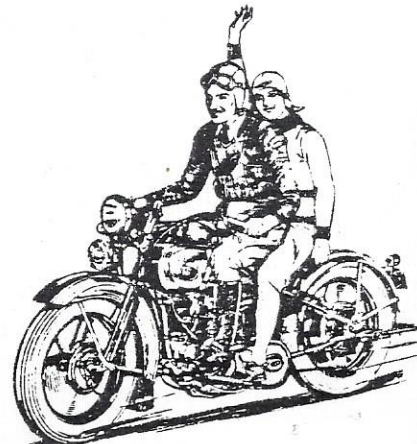

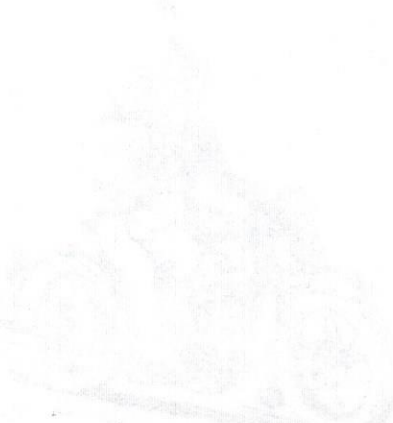

The amendment from "vintage cars" to "vintage vehicles" came about last month. So for example, I license my old Harley Davidson 45, 1943 for only \$ 19.00, including plate and \$ 50,000.00 liability.

Dear Mr. Norrie:

This refers to your correspondence of March, 1978, with Mr. P. Dygala when you had requested a change to the Highway Traffic Act to accomodate the registration of trucks and motorcycles as antique vehicles.

I am pleased to advise you that section 306 of the Highway Traffic Act has now been amended to provide for the registration of trucks and motorcycles under the "Antique" classification and to provide for the operation of antique trucks and motorcycles under the same condition as provided for antique cars.

Any persons wishing to register an antique truck or motorcycle under the "Antique" classification, may now do so.

Barry W. Hewitt, Director of Licencing."

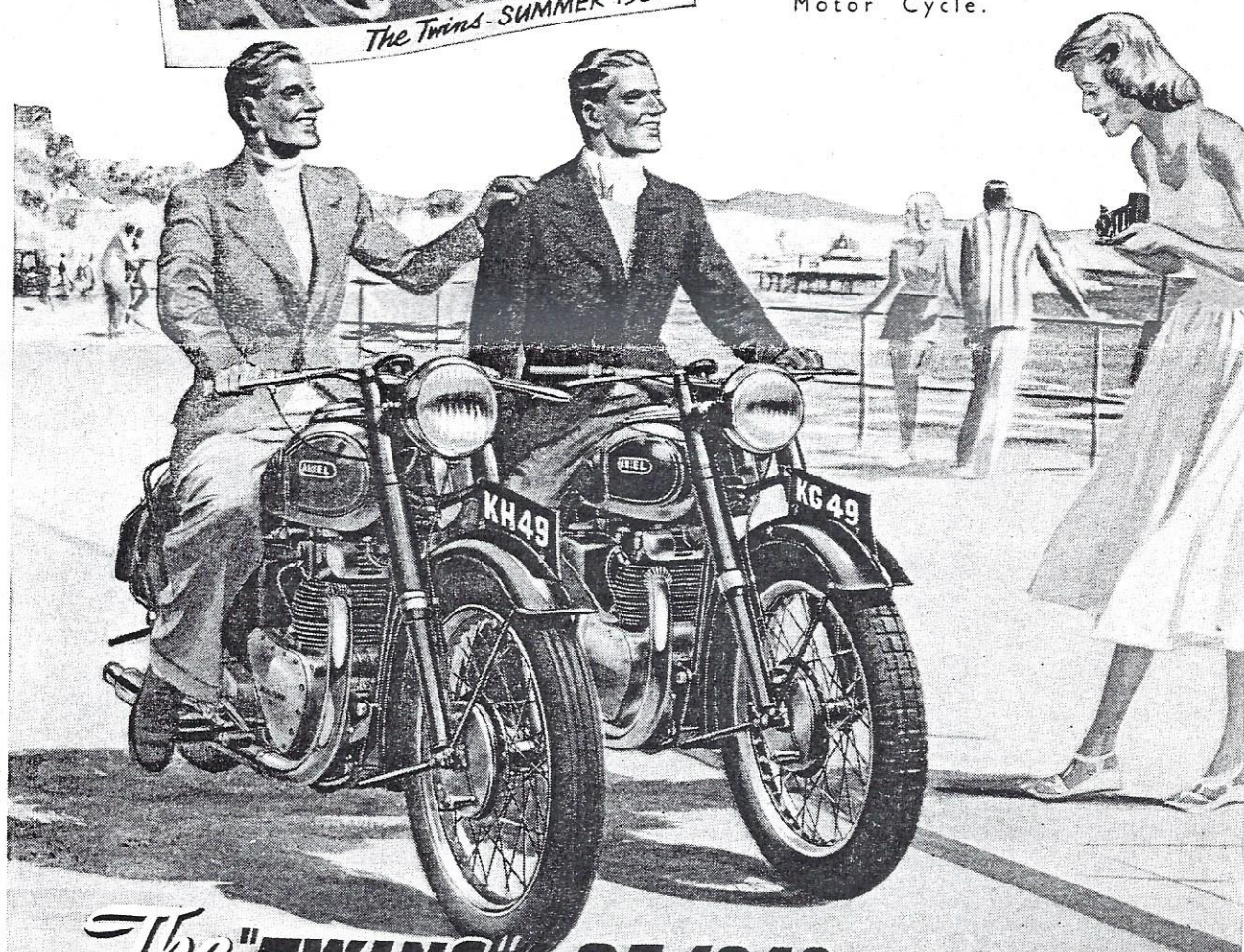

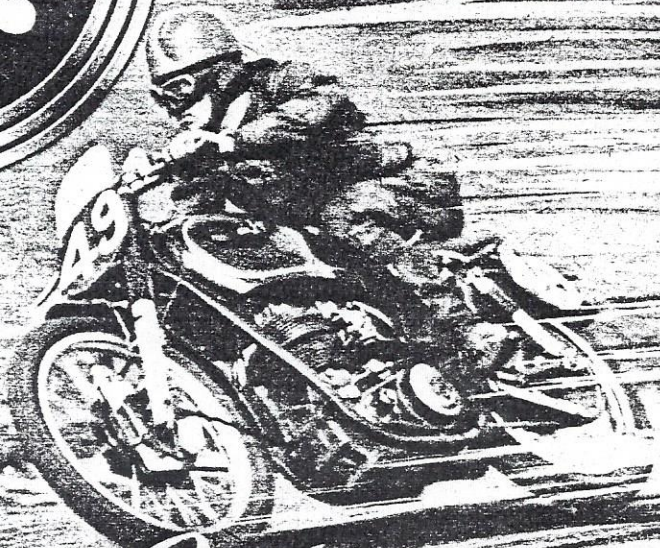
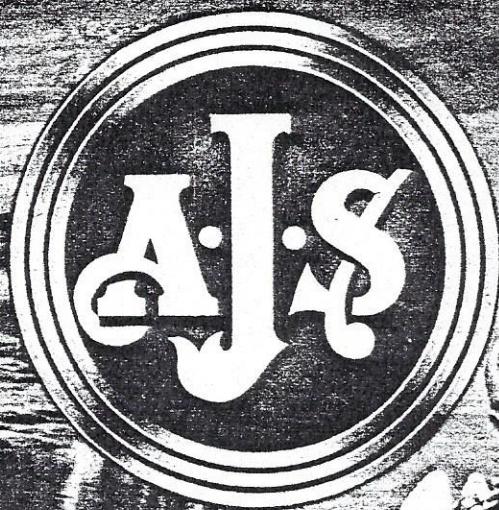
