HOME-MADE BATTERY TERMINALS

Molded Connector that is Easily Made

A mold is cut in three-ply wood to the shape required. The end of the battery cable is bared and the wire splayed out. After the wire has been treated with flux it is laid in the mold, into which molten lead is poured until the wire is completely covered. When the terminal has cooled it is drilled to fill the battery lug, and then filled up to give a neat finish.
