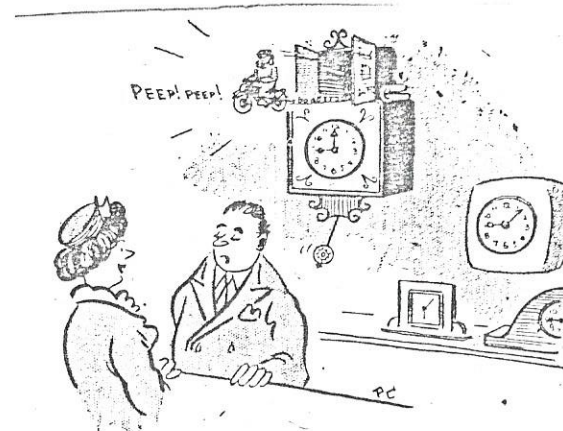


MEMBERSHIP DUES

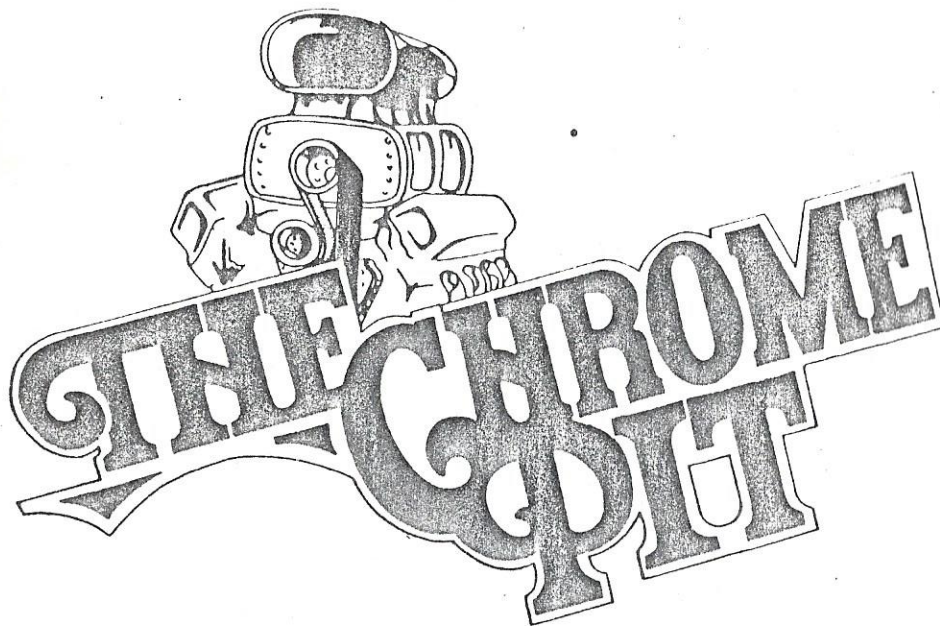
