



We should all thank Fletcher Reid for the donation of the two 8 x 10 Photos of his 1945 Indian Chief to the Club. They are just beautiful.


They will be presented to Rothmans and Molsons as soon as we get the frame and the lettering put on. Thanks again Fletcher for the donation.


