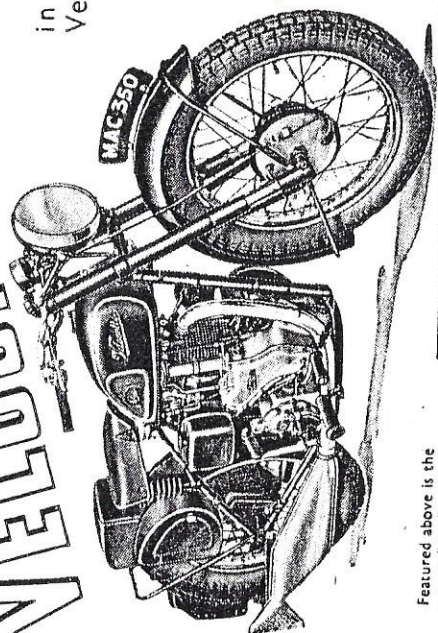
Sorry I forgot to put in the dates of our Donut Runs on our last newsletter. They are in now so check out the location, time and date in our Event Calendar.

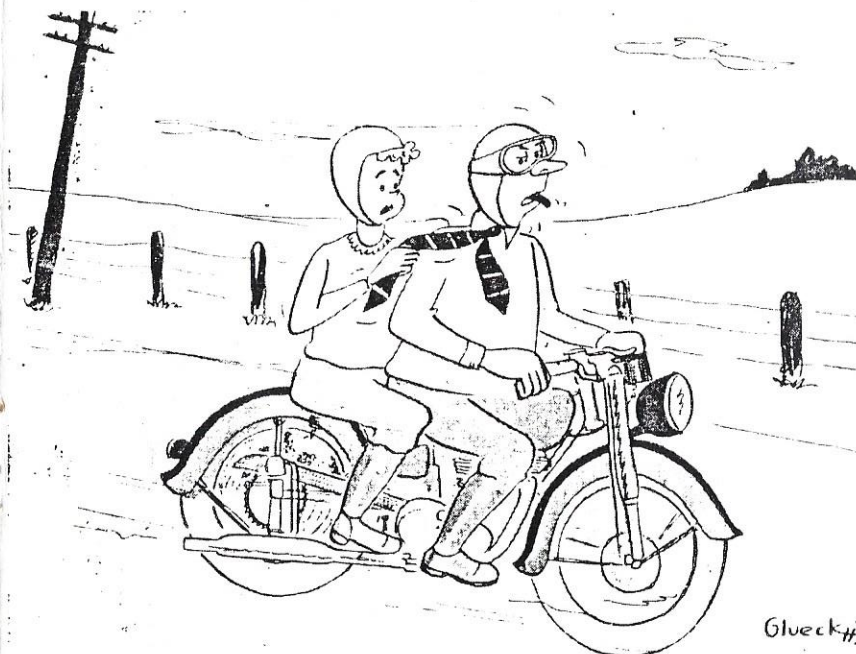

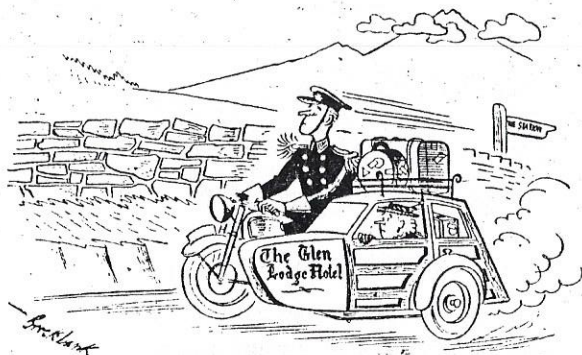

As well, Tiny has been nominated for an Academy Award for good fellowship! Thanks for your help Tiny.

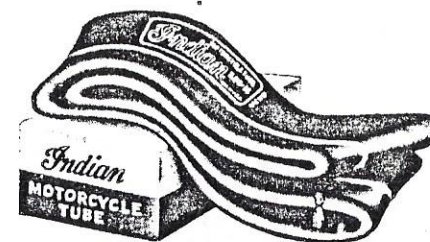

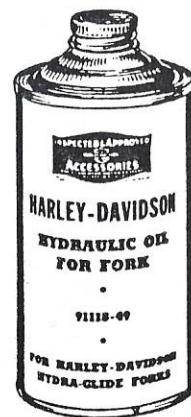
