Winter is already here and many of us have a few projects to finish up for next year or start on a new project. I know for sure there will be a few more old vintage bikes on the road.



Well sports fans - this is your hero and mine-me with what amounts to my last column as editor of this rag.



A trench was dug completely around the bike so they could get under it and lift it up the right way. This they eventually accomplished and gazed upon the object of their search. No rims, spokes or mudguards, several holes in the tank and a badly corroded alloy crank case, but otherwise appearing to be in reasonable order in spite of its twenty-seven years buried, as it was in 1936 that it was discarded.

The only hard work left was to carry it up the bank to the trailer, and this they did as Bill brought the tractor up from the creek on the flat survace of the paddock. Final thanks and goodbyes were said, and some time later they were back in town. A hose soon washed off the last of the mud and revealed the machine its glory.

During the week Glen dissected the bike and was quite pleased with what I found. The tank was of no further use. but as it's complete with all edges and corners and was a perfect pattern for a new one. The frame and forks appeared to be guite sound. apart form the usual rust pitting. Both wheel hubs could be used, together with the pedalling gear and various frame brackets. The magneto, exhaust pipe, muffler, handlebar levers, and carbeuretor were all in repairable condition. The engine had had it. The alloy crank case was corroded away completely and the fins on the barrel broke off at the slightest touch. Flywheels and the pistons were in good shape, together with some engine parts which were made of brass.

What was the bike:

- -Approximately 500cc engine.
- -Varaible speed engine pulley (This could be an optional extra)
- -Fully sprung leading link front suspension.
- -Two-level Brown and Barlow carb.
- -Magneto driven by double eccentric crank.
- -External contracting rear brake oper -ating on hub worked by cam action when back pedalling on pedals.
- -Seat sprung by action similiar to Indian and Harley-Davidson.

Yes it was the Minerva!

Some parts were found. Up to November 1965, no real further work was done to other family commitments, however, a venture of such mixed beginnings and varying fortunes must surely find its reward in complete restoration.

However, Mr. French and Bill were not to be put off by this, and decided to cut the trench back into the hillside from where the bike was thrown. Another hour saw the trench progressively moved sideways about three feet into the hill without any sign of the bike.

By mutual consent an adjournment was taken for lunch at this stage, and while Bill and his father disappeared in the direction of the homestead they sat down on the tractor and surveyed the havoc they had caused as they had their lunch. The rain which had been falling at all times during the morning started again and Glen thought of what he could have been doing at home instead pedal with a bright shiny thread on one end where it had been wrenched



Suddenly Jack leaped forward from behind the tractor blade and came back grinning all over his face as he showed us a one end where it had been wrenched out of its crank by the tractor blade. Bill eased the tractor back till it was well clear of the spot. then they tried with the detector, being rewarded with a very satisfying contact. Spades and shovels were seized and within a few minutes the engine and sundry frame parts were exposed. Glen concentrated on the gas tank, finding out its shape and size as with veteran motorcycles the tank shape often gives a good indication of the machine's age.


until Chuck and Sandra Murray leave.


