The BC Trip 1976

We'll start at the beginning.

Myself and two buddies decided to embark on our first major (out of province) bike trip with Vancouver as a destination. Our rides were a 74 Honda Goldwing, a 75 900 Kaw, and my 73 900 Kaw. The Goldwing owner was also the original owner of my 900.

We left on the last Saturday of July that year on what turned out to be the start of the August long weekend. Even though it was July, it was really cold that morning (+6 C) and I was glad I had gloves on. Andy, on the Goldwing, forgot his gloves and suffered the cold until it warmed up around Brandon. He was quite an amazing rider and repeatedly drove many miles with his right hand warming up in his pocket and his left hand on the throttle!

We made good time that day and by supper time we were approaching Medicine Hat, Alberta. That's when the trip got interesting. Just before town, we passed a "free" campground (we found out later why it was free) and decided that's where we would spend the night. We brought along one of those cheap, orange nylon, 3 man pup tents and sleeping bags. We were looking forward to a good nights sleep after all those miles. We knew would be having a few "bubblies" so we picked a spot far away from the other campers, near what we thought was an abandoned railroad track.

Ken (the 75 Kaw owner) and I started setting up the tent and sent Andy and his Goldwing into town to find some beer. That should have only taken about 20 minutes, but an hour and a half later, we were still waiting. We knew Andy liked his beer and thought maybe he decided to have few in the pub before coming back with a dozen. Another half hour went by and we (Ken and I) decided to go into town and look for him. Right then a white, 66 Ford pulled up to where we were, and we could see that Andy was in the passenger seat. I thought, "Oh great, he wrecked his Honda on the first day of the trip." On the plus side, he did remember to bring back a dozen beer......

After thanking the Ford owner for the ride, Andy explained that while he was looking around for a beer vendor, he managed to drift off the road which had a very sharp drop-off. The bottom of the Goldwing motor made contact with the cement and he smashed the water pump which is located at the bottom front. It promptly puked it's antifreeze. He nursed it to the vendor parking lot nearby and assessed the damage. Any quick repair was not an option so he parked it next to a chain link fence, locked it up, got the beer, and looked for a ride back to the campsite. Keep in mind that this was on a Saturday night of a long weekend, nothing would be open on Sunday or Monday. Not a very good start to our first long trip. Back at the campsite, we all decided not to cry over spilled milk (or antifreeze) so we enjoyed our beers and went to bed. We would figure out something tomorrow.

It was about then why we discovered the campground was free. Being located right on the Trans Canada highway, there was a lot of truck traffic all night long, and it seemed like every few minutes each of them would give a blast of their air horns as they passed. We eventually fell asleep, in time for our next surprise.

It turns out the abandoned train track was not abandoned after all. Our tent was pitched close to a curve in the track and in the middle of the night a train did show up. It's headlight shone directly into our tent and the engineer must have had a sense of humour because he decided to give us a long blast of his horn.

So we all awoke to a train's headlight glaring into our orange pup tent and the deafening sound of the horn. My first thought was that the train was going to ram right through the tent and we were goners. All three of us scrambled to unzip the tent and escape, all the while with the horn still blasting. We made it out and we ran for our lives. Of course, we were in no real danger because the railroad track curved, but when you've only been awake for 15 seconds, you go with instinct.

The engineer of the train must have a had a really good laugh from all this and I imagine he's retold the same story many times, but from his field of view.

The next day (Sunday) we drove to where the Honda spent the night and tried to come up with a plan. There was only one Honda dealer in town and wouldn't be open until Tuesday. The aluminum water pump cover was broken into many small pieces and to make matters worse, the plastic impeller was also destroyed. The prognosis wasn't good. Looks like we were going to spend a few days in Medicine Hat. We stayed in a motel that night so that we could take a shot at repairing the water pump cover with epoxy cement, but it didn't look like it would hold.

On the holiday Monday, we phoned around and found the owner of the Honda dealership. He said that he had very few Goldwing parts in stock, and was certain he didn't have a water pump. We asked him nicely if he would consider taking one off of a bike on the showroom floor, but wouldn't budge. He did get hold of dealer in Calgary though that had a cover, but no impeller.

We decided to take another shot at fixing the broken cover to at least make it to Calgary. Across the field from the motel, we found an old screen door. and cut a square of screen out from it. Another trip to the convenience store for more epoxy cement (the old slow stuff, not the 5 minute variety) and we beefed up the

cover with it and some of the screen. We had to let the glue harden overnight. The next morning we put in on the motor, filled it up water and fired it up. Even though the impeller was shot, it looked like at least the motor would hold coolant. We took it for a test ride, the temperature gauge was a little on the high side, but not in the red. We took off the radiator cap so that pressure wouldn't build up. Calgary, here we come.

We made it less than 10 miles out of town before the epoxy decided to let loose and the water gushed out. It was too far to limp the Goldwing back into town so we decided that I would go back and buy some rope so we could tow the Wing back to Medicine Hat. I found a hardware store and bought a 50 ft length of yellow nylon rope. Back on the roadside, I hooked one end to the Goldwings fork and the other to the sissy bar on my 73 Z1.

Not sure how we arrived at the next decision (we hadn't been drinking yet), but I thought "if I'm going to tow you anyways, how about I tow you to Calgary instead of Medicine Hat"? We looked at the map, the distance was about 160 miles. At a "safe" 20 mph, we could make it in about 8 hours. In our favour, the highway shoulders were in good condition, a lot of it paved. If we stayed on them, maybe we could avoid a ticket should we be stopped by the RCMP.

My 900 Kaw had no problem whatsoever towing the Goldwing. Lots of power to spare. As the miles went by, the 20 mph slowly became 30 mph, then 40 mph. we got a lot of strange looks from the passing vehicles. We pulled over for a rest every hour or so. The rope could only be tied to one of the Goldwings forks, so Andy had to countersteer the whole way. At one of these rest stops, we decided "WTF, everything seems to be going well, let's just tow on the road with the rest of the traffic, AT 60 MPH!" The young mind is a terrible thing.....

And that's what we did for the rest of the way, 60 mph, even passing slower traffic many times. You should have seen the look on some of the drivers as they saw a 900 Kawasaki pass them, then spot the 50 feet of nylon rope and finally the Goldwing. Good thing there were no dash cams back then. We never did see a Mountie that day, but managed to break the rope 5 or 6 times due to emergency braking.

We hit Calgary right at rush hour. The other motorists were pretty good about our situation, some having a good laugh. Made it to a hotel and waited for the Calgary Honda dealer to open in the morning. We bought his only waterpump cover and gasket, went back to the hotel, installed it, filled the motor with water and booted it out to the coast. Remember the water pump impeller was almost non-exitant, so any water movement in the motor was due to convection.

It was raining hard when we left Calgary and it didn't stop until 400 miles later, in Kamloops. Even though we had rainsuits on, we still got soaked. We stopped at

a steakhouse on the highway, and by the time we left, there was a huge puddle of water under our table. But hey, once you get totally wet, you can't get any wetter. Andy mentioned that with 3 wet disk brake rotors, he virtually had no brakes for that leg of the journey.

The stretch to Vancouver was uneventful, the Goldwing didn't seem to suffer at all. We found a Honda dealer there that had a water pump assembly with the impeller in stock and we installed it. Then it rained for 3 more days. We took the bikes on the ferry over to the island and drove in the rain there for a while.

We made the return trip back through the northern states, camping mainly at KOAs. Beautiful scenery and gas was cheap.

Looking back on that trip, I have wondered how we decided towing another motorcycle for 160 miles was a good idea. Now whenever I see yellow nylon rope, I think of that trip.

All's well that ends well.

Hello members. On June 11 get ready for an unprecedented and History making day, with a ride to honor Sadie Grimm.

Sadie Grimm was the winner of the first motorcycling prize ever awarded in Canada to a woman in a competition open to men. The June 20, 1914 headline in the Motoring section of the Manitoba Free Press read *Lady Wins Gold Medal*. What made this achievement remarkable is that nineteen-year-old Sadie succeeded where many male motorcycle riders before her had failed.

Back in the winter of 1913/14, the Manitoba Motorcycle Club had offered a medal to the first motorcyclist to make the trip from Winnipeg to Winnipeg Beach. While this almost 100-kilometre challenge might seem an odd choice today, it was the perfect fit for the time.

In July 2015, a group ride commemorating the 1914 Gold Medal win of Sadie Grimm was organized by the Manitoba Motorcycle Club (Antique Motorcycle Club of Manitoba) and celebrated over 100 years of women motorcyclists in Manitoba.


The ride followed MMC President Ross Metcalfe's acceptance speech for the MMC at the Canadian Motorcycle Hall of Fame the previous fall in which he mentioned Grimm's accomplishment.

As noted by Ross, the award preceded a woman's right to vote.

In February 2016, at a meeting of the Coalition of Manitoba Motorcycle Groups -WRC (Women's Riders council) chair Mary Johnson raised the idea of doing additional research and verification relating to Sadie Grimm. At that meeting, it was agreed that Carolyn Peters would lead the research. Subsequently, Carolyn's partner Paul Peters would also join the effort.

The research of the CMMG WRC proved this story was true. Finding articles about the event, with challenges such as misspelt names and incorrect dates, resulted in the fortunate finding of the wedding announcement of Sadie to James Cruikshank in the Tribune September 10, 1914 Social Section.



Blast from the Past

Motorcycle matters

My article this month will cover two famous small Machines built and marketed in the 1925 to 1934 era. At that time Big Harleys and Indians were the order of the day and these large heavy machines did not appeal to all potential riders so both factories turned their attention to a small 350 cc Single cylinder type. In the 1963 Summer issue of the Antique Motorcycle Club of America's quarterly magazine "Antique Motorcycles" there was an excellent article by Art Tucker on these two machines and I am taking the liberty of drawing extensively from Art's article.

The year was 1925, the middle of the "roaring 20s". The two contenders named the Indian Prince and the Harley Davidson new single. These machines were 21 Cubic inch four stroke singles and both were offered in the side valve and an overhead valve version. Much engineering and design work was lavished on these little machines and as a consequence, they introduced many new features for their respective breeds one of the most important being the detachable cylinder head. Now it was possible to remove the cylinder head clean the carbon, reinstall the head and be ready to ride in 20 minutes "As stated in the catalog" all without removing the engine from the frame. Because new riders were reluctant to start out with a heavy machine these light weights filled a distinct need as they do today. The factories stressed safety economy and ease of handling in these light machines to appeal to the parents of youngsters who wanted a motorcycle.

While the experienced motorcycle enthusiast tended to look on these machines with scorn, to the extent of calling them nicknames such as peashooter, putt putt, one popper, and some names which were unprintable. The fact remains that these cycles we're responsible for garnering many new adherents into the fraternity who later graduated to larger machines. It is ironic that while these bike started life as a safe easy handling machine for amateurs many of them ended up broadsiding on dirt and cinder short tracks in the late 20s and early 30s in the hands of professionals. It is also interesting to note that after the discontinuance of the singles the two factories did not make a single until 1948 when Indian introduced the arrow and Harley Davidson a 125 cc. With this background let's get going to the individuality's of these two motorcycles

The Indian prince

The prince single was introduced in 1925, it was a completely new Machine, quite unlike the scope and chief of the period. The lightweight frame and fork arrangements were designed exclusively for it as were all sold the compact three speed transmission and clutch. All of these features were later used on the pony scout and sports coat models on the wall the latter were twins the first branch motorcycles were furnished with pegs instead of foot boards and had short flat handlebars, with hand clutch and brake levers on the bars later models had conventional floorboards and clutch and brake pads of the first models had a weird shape fuel and oil tank but in 1920 and nicely shaped to drop tank was used which was similar to the 101 scout. In 1920 front brake was added in common with the other Indian models.

Colours

The prince models were standard Indian red, with exception to special orders. Then gold stripes on both sides of the tank in addition to an Indian script. Some later models had prince in small block letters under the Indian script. Wheels were black

<u>The Harley Davidson new single</u>

The new single it was introduced in 1926 and was accompanied by extensive national advertising. The main point stressed in this advertising was 80 miles per gallon. This was a real capable little single which could do 50 to 60 mph and the overhead valve sport model was advertised to do 65 and upward. Like the prince, it had many new features which the Big twins did not have. It had a newly designed fork springing arrangement which was light and very stable. These forks were so well liked that they are still being used on some hillclimbing motorcycles today. The arrangement of the fork springing was later used on the twins the three speed transmission and clutch we're also designed for this machine and a nicer, more rugged little box could not be found. This transmission was later used on the 45 cubic inch twin with very little change. The engine was a little masterpiece of design as the speed boys soon found out. It was a real breather with ample port area and large valves. It had a good bottom end and could be modified to put out a lot more then came from the factory. The intake and exhaust cams are geared so that each one can be advanced or retarded independently and with a little grinding of the cams, some real wild valve timing was possible. The overhead valve engine had the roller tappets and double valve springs which really snapped them shut. The overhead valve model was used extensively for night speedway racing on the short tracks with good results in the early 30s, but they were no match for the imports built especially for racing and gradually past from the racing scene. In 1929 Harley introduced at 30.5 cubic inch single along with the 45 inch twin. This single was known as the model C and was continued along with the 21 inch side valve single until 1934

Colours

1926 to 1929 all were olive green early wheels olive green later wheels were black. A half inch wide maroon stripe on the tanks with a thin gold stripe in centre. Also there was Harley Davidson in red block letters with black and gold edging.
