Mark has provided the very earliest club picture I have ever seen, 1910. Not only does it show Joe Baribeau first in line on a 1000 cc Indian but it confirms the legislation of the day that motorcycles once registered made their own plates following the government specs (more on that at a later time) until the first motorcycle plate in 1912. My 1911 records show Joe having plate number 50 and you can clearly see plate number 50 on his bike as well as several others. This was the Winnipeg Motorcycle Club which later blended with the Manitoba Motorcycle club (Feb 1911 INC) It was always known that at the time of the formation of the MMC there were two clubs, but the Winnipeg name gave way to the MMC, our club today since 1911. Mark your calendars — the third rendition of the Teulon Ride-In Rally is coming up this summer.

The event is set for July 14 to benefit Project New Hope Canada, a non-profit and non-political organization that aims to support veterans and their families to get education training and skills after operational service.

Like last year, the fundraising event will take place along Teulon's Main Street, which will be closed from Third Avenue to Fifth Avenue for motorcycles and pedestrians only.

Whether you have a motorcycle or not, there will be plenty of entertainment for all ages, including motorcycle games, bicycle games, skills games and kids' games. There will also be face painting, music, food and vendors all day.

In addition, the Teulon Rockwood Fire Department will have a rescue demo.

The Antique Motorcycle Club of Manitoba has added the Teulon rally to its sanctioned ride list.

The organizers thank Sunova Credit Union and Red River Co-op as major corporate sponsors. Both businesses donated \$500 to this year's ride last week.

Additional thanks go out to Mitch and Adele Chornoby, Steve Shinnie Law Offi ces, Teulon Tractor & Motor, Kletke Seed Farm, Charison's Turkey Hatchery, Integrity Auto and Vic's Auto.

They would also like to thank Teulon town council for their support and help, along with CAO Doreen Steg and Glenn Marmonier of public works.

Rally organizer David Leduchowski said without the support, the rally would be impossible to host.

A MOTORCYCLE is a bicycle with a pandemonium attachment and is designed for the special use of mechanical geniuses, daredevils and lunatics.

The motorcycle is equipped with a motor small enough to be put in a large pocket and loud enough to fill a coliseum comfortably. This motor is connected with the rear wheels of the bicycle, and when it is in the mood will revolve the wheel with tremendous speed, thus causing the bicycle to proceed from hither and yon over buggies, pedestrians, fences and small outbuildings.

A motorcycle is really a miniature automobile with full-sized noise, smell and dirt output. It is not started by cranking, however, but by pedaling the whole machine along the road until the motor emerges from its coma and gets on the job. An automobilist can be detected by his vast overhanging shoulders and calloused hands. A motorcyclist, however, may have arms like pipestems, but his legs are seven sizes too large for him.

A motorcycle is not as comfortable as a camel or a lumber wagon, but it is very swift, and there is nothing that feels more like flying than to ride a large baritone motorcycle over the country roads at 50 miles an hour, leaping lightly from bump to bump — except to leave the machine when it has struck a rock and to soar swiftly through the unstable atmosphere until some jagged section of the United States interferes with further progress.

Motorcycles are very useful and have almost annihilated distance and cheap clothes. They should be ridden in costume, except by very wealthy and careless men. A pair of leather pants with asbestos lining and a two-bushel hip pocket for tools, a padded vest, heavy gloves, a pair of goggles, and nose and shin guards make a tasty and useful rig for the cyclist. Dressed in this fashion the enthusiast can enjoy himself to the full as he caroms from tree to tree and gorges himself with dust, oil and excitement.

Motorcycles are not as fatal to pedestrians as automobiles, because they can only run over him with two wheels. But they should be treated with respect at all times and should not be interfered with when in a hurry.



Motorcycles are much cheaper than automobiles, and there seems to be no practical remedy for this, and the industry is unfortunately not in the hands of a trust. However, if the devotee does not possess \$150 he can get almost as good results by drinking a little lubricating oil, inhaling a vacuum cleaner and setting off two bushels of firecrackers between his legs.

DID YOU KNOW???

That Chas P has done over 340,000 MILES and counting on his R90/6 BMW. That's over half a million kilometres!

He bought it new in 1975 and averages about 8000 miles every year and rarely misses an AMCM meeting or event. He also has a 1970's period sidecar which he still hooks up occasionally to give his grandkids a ride, or once for an 80 plus year old lady whose daughter had asked him to fulfill her mothers bucket list and give her a ride around Winkler! The sidecar was also hooked up for family holidays and many trips to Sturgis, with wife Viola on the pillion and his two little girls in the sidecar, plus a tent and all their camping gear and clothes! The 900cc Airhead is still almost stock original with classic BMW black paintwork and twin white pin-striping. Only non-stock items are a period Vetter Windjammer fairing, a Dyna III electronic ignition and some LED light conversions. Chas keeps his old airhead very well maintained mechanically and is a wizard at setting those Bing carbs to do a beautiful "potato- - potato" idle, by feel and sound only, and says he has changed "too many tires to count!", and repaired a puncture with patch kit on the road "more than once!"

Some Tech Stuff.

TCLOCS

For many parts of the country, the snow has or is melting. With the sun shining and the mercury rising, we are all getting that itch to get back on two wheels.

If you are not lucky enough to live in a climate that offers year round riding, your motorcycle has probably been dormant for at least a few months. So, consider as you saddle up this spring, the first ride of the season requires some extra awareness. Make sure to run your bike through TCLOCS as explained below. To help you remember, the Motorcycle Safety Foundation suggests the acronym TCLOCS.

T= Tires and Wheels C= Controls L= Lights & Electric O= Oil, Gas, Fluids C= Chassis S= Side Stand

Even if you stored your motorcycle in a closed garage, trickle charged your battery, your bike is still subject to deterioration and damage. Critters chew, cables come loose, hoses can crack.....you get the idea. Before you hit the road, always give your bike a full top down inspection. Include checking everything from tire pressure to fluid levels before you put wheels to pavement. Your owner's manual has more specific information regarding the items on this check list.

I know most of us do this but in our hurry to get back out there sometimes we rush. That can come back to bite us in the rear!

Blast from the past

Motorcycle Matters

1930 HENDERSON 4

For the past 52 years I have been interested in motorcycles and had always wanted a Henderson, which is a large 1300 c.c. in-line 4 cylinder machine. For five years from 1960 to 1965, I searched diligently for a sample but they are as scarce as hens teeth. However, during one of my periodic calls to motorcycle people in Minneapolis I mentioned my wishes to a fellow collector. A couple of years later I received a note from him saying that a Mr. Maynard Whetstone of Winona Minnesota, who collects Indian fours, had come across a very good sample of a Henderson

I got in touch with Mr Whetstone by phone and learned that the machine was a 1930 model KY, which was the second last year of production of this fine motorcycle. The deal was closed over the phone subject to my approval of the photograph which would be mailed to me and which subsequently confirmed the deal.


In the meantime I paid a visit to Her Majesties Collector of Customs and learned to my horror that second hand motorcycles could not be imported into Canada however the customs man, who had, believe it or not, once owned a Henderson was most helpful, and we discovered that antique motor vehicles could be imported. After Mutual discussion it was agreed that a Henderson was an antique motor vehicle so the die was cast.

It was then I learned that the trucking firm would not except the machine unless it was crated. More long-distance phone calls to Wynonna and Mr. Whetstone finally agreed to crate the machine.

It arrived in Winnipeg in good shape on December 30, 1965.

My long search was over and during the search I had collected six other antique machines. Perhaps it was worth the waiting after all.

In 1977 I decided to reduce my collection of bikes and the "Hen" is now in Grand Forks in the garage of Lynn Hapster .
