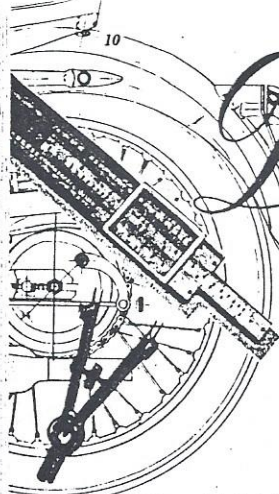
Further on the "Auto Hazmat" course, we have a course outline, but I didn't see the date for it.

Jim told us more about the Swap Meet July 11, , Show..... to be free. Swap Meetto charge \$10.00 per space,,,probably use tennis court for everything.

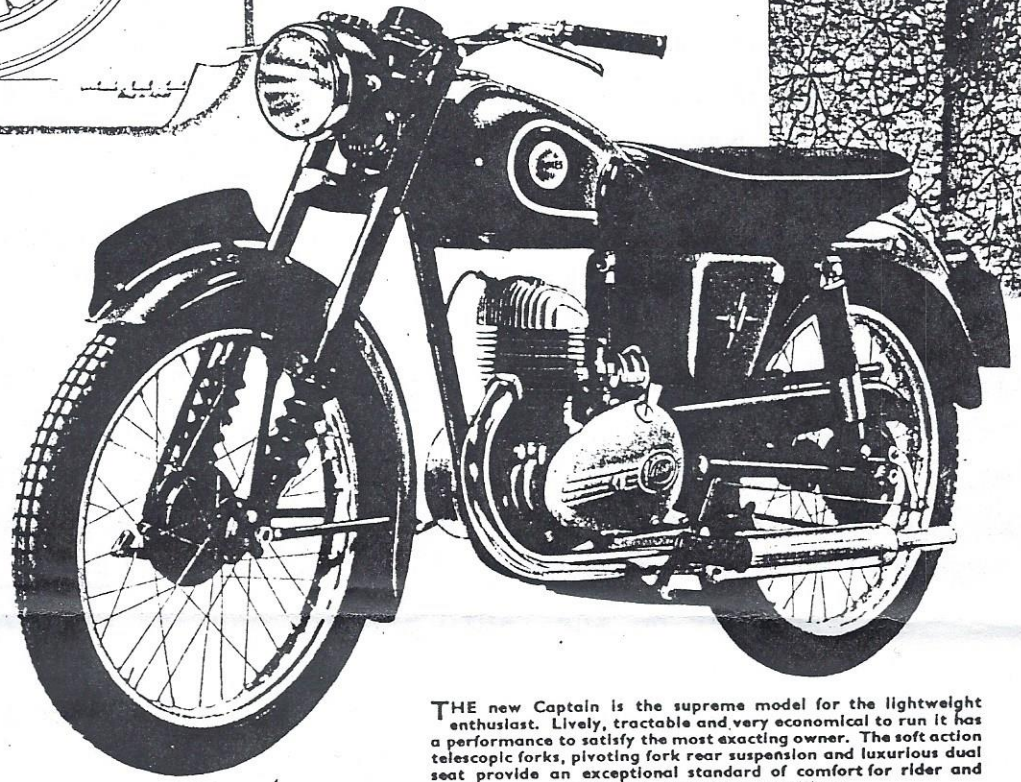
