

- 1.MAAC dues in future will be \$1 per club member, with a \$25 minimum per club. MAAC will also recommend and promote membership in NAAACCC, a National lobby group, with dues of \$1.50 per member.

- 6.MAAC need a list of all club OPEN activities for publishing in the activities schedule that MAAC puts out. This is required by next meeting, Feb. 25. Ed P


Activities Chairman


