Tech Tips.....by Bookworm

I got out my trusty Ampmeter and did some comparisons just for my own satisfaction,

12V rectangular sealed beam 4000 series....2.5amps

Bosch halogen 75w/70w....4.0amps

Cibie tungsten 45w/40w....3.9/3.4amps
Brake light #1156, 32 candlepower..2.0amps
Tungsten 45/40w.....7.0/5.6amps

As you can see, the 6v headlight sure needs more amps. Connector quality is critical so as not to have excessive resistance. High resistance produces a hot contact that sometimes burns up the terminal ends beyond repair. A Voltmeter can be used for a Voltage Drop Test to confirm a good contact in all circuits. In closing, it's obvious 6V systems had larger wires to flow more amps; and circuit integrity was very critical to bright lights, or easy starting.


