At the November meeting, a representative from Sask Mutual Insurance presented their package for extension coverage (over the MPIC minimums). They offer agreed value policies and the coverage carries on when the vehicle is laid up for the winter. Their rates are \$1.60 per hundred dollars of value. They are willing to cover motorcycles if we can provide a reliable method of determining value, such as a published value guide.

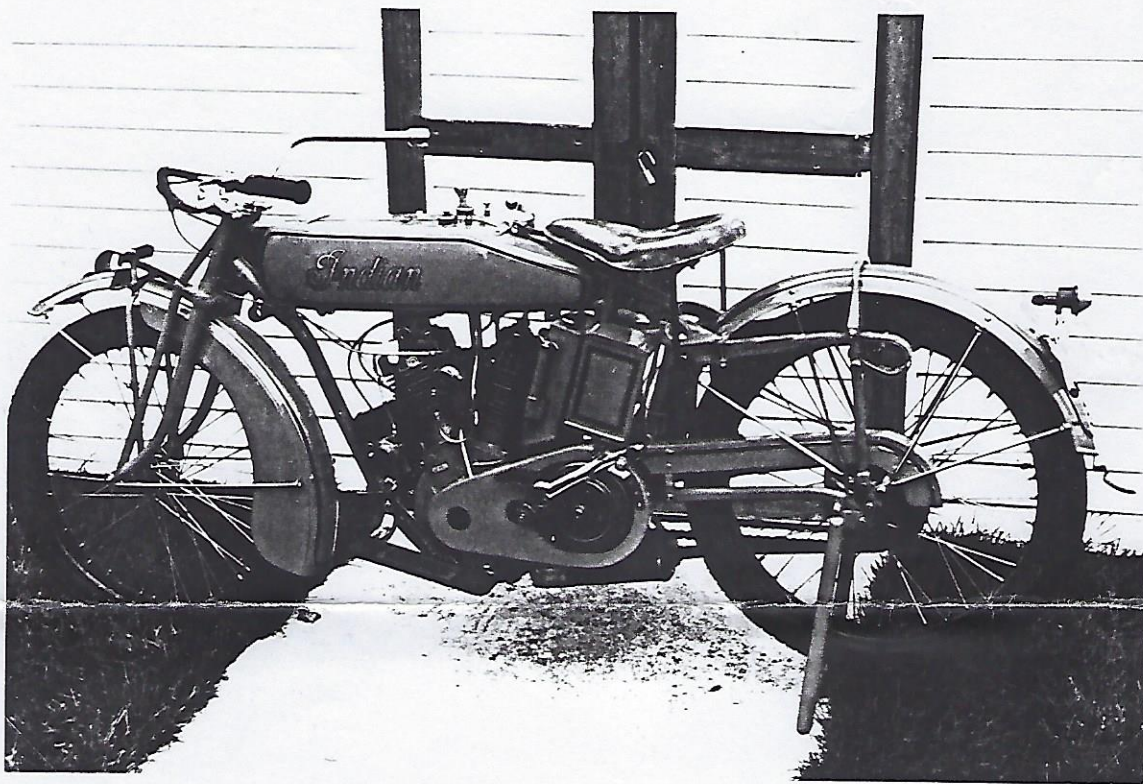
