





Minutes of AMCM Meeting April 24, 2007

In attendance: 23 members including three new members

- The President called the meeting to order at 7:55 p.m. This was not an easy task as attention was focused on the buffet table, heavily laden with complimentary snacks and beverages.
- The President opened the meeting with a sarcastic thank-you to Ross Metcalfe for encouraging attendance at the Antique Show on May 4. Those attending felt that some miscommunication must have occurred. Mr. Metcalfe's AMCM membership will be reviewed later; disciplinary measures were not ruled out.
- The membership was reminded that the Breast Cancer Pledge Ride is on June 10. Attendance and participation were strongly encouraged as our Club has a long history of supporting this cause.
- Another event of interest will be the CVMG Cross-Canada Run. It was estimated by an astute geographically-talented member (without the use of a GPS device) that the arrival date of the tour would be July 22. The President can be contacted for more precise information as the ETA nears.
- Treasurer Klann noted that the bank balance is now \$3,079.74. The Treasurer wondered why the amount needs to be this large when there are no plans in place for reducing it. The Secretary has a plan, secret but clever, for the dispersal of all of the remaining funds. This plan will be revealed at an Executive-only in camera meeting to be held at "The Leather Ranch" on a date the Secretary will arrange.
- The Treasurer concluded his portion of the meeting by reminding the group of the immediate deadline for membership dues. His steely gaze fixed on no one in particular when he tantalized the assembled with the revelation that two well-known, near legendary members were in arrears! Enough said.
- Dave Pritchard, Publisher, with just pride, announced that the Club Roster will be available next month. The membership nodded their approval for this news as this will surely fill a gap in the summer must-read list.
- Librarian Mike Baraschuk reported that the literature collection continues to expand. Members are encouraged to work with him and keep this valuable resource an important part of Club activity.
- Tom Hessom announced that the AJS/Matchless Club of America has over 2,000 members. He then provided a connection between that statistic and our Club by informing the group that John Thompson was now a Director of the AJS/Matchless Club. Thunderous applause followed, to which an emotional John Thompson was unable to respond.
- Ross Metcalfe told the meeting that club promotion booths are available at the Minnesota Rally. He will attend and represent the AMCM interests.
- The President, to a question, stated that the Rally-07 official colours would definitely be yellow and black, if not another colour combination, depending on availability and spiritual inspiration.
- The President then brought out the topic of erection difficulties. Everyone was assured, however, that the tent would be in place and fully functionally by Thursday evening in plenty of time for the Rally on Friday.
- The suggestion was put forth that Club meetings continue to be held at the more opulent Harley-Davidson site until October, at which time returning to the chummier Woodhaven clubhouse is likely since the rent is paid there.
- The President adjourned the meeting. Some members lingered to dispose of the remaining hospitality graciously provided by the host.

Minutes of the AMCM Meeting May 29, 2007

In attendance: 23 members




The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 p.m.




