-- It was suggested that AMCM make representation at the organizer's fall meeting to clarify AMCM club status, role and participation at the 2007 event.

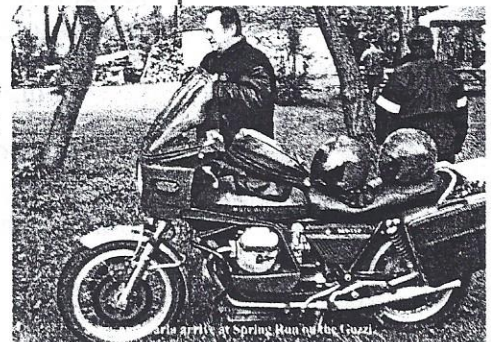
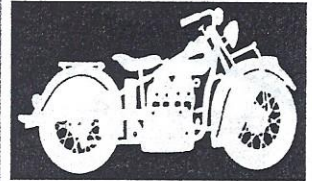

The meeting adjourned at 9:35 without (again) observing the tradition of singing the national anthem.



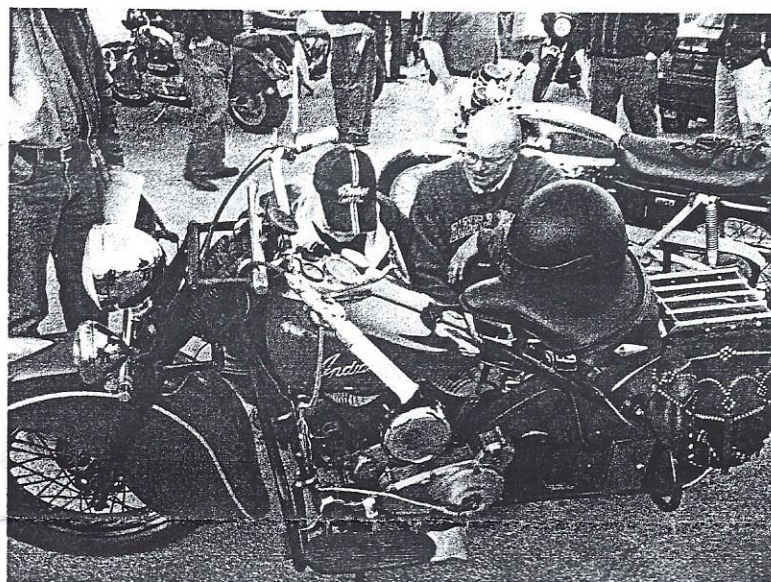

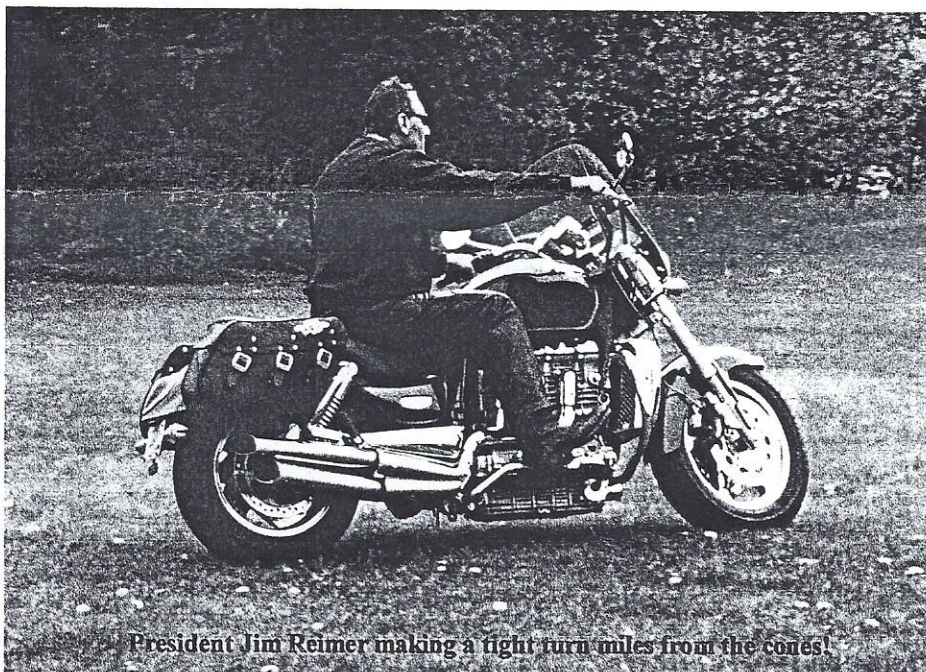

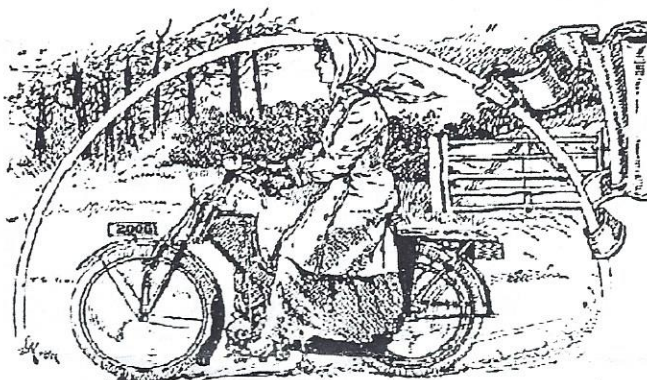
