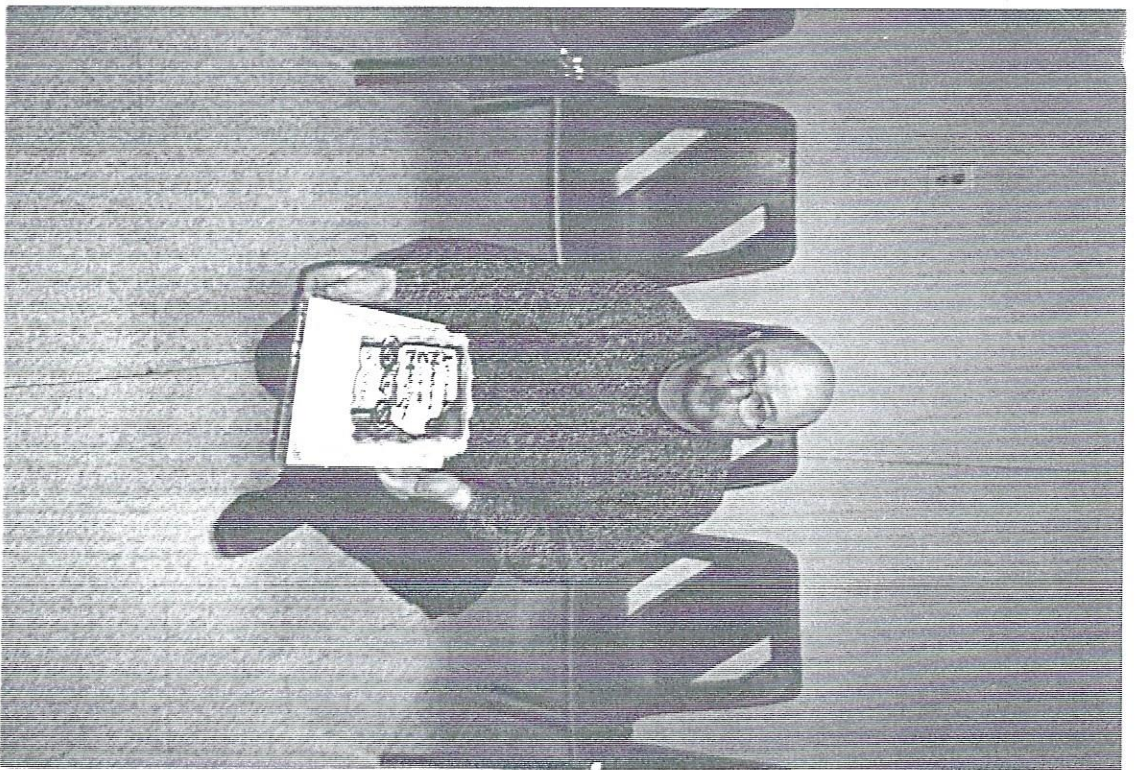
There were comments on Len Hardy's Vincent and it's low mileage due to the fact it was so fast and powerfull.

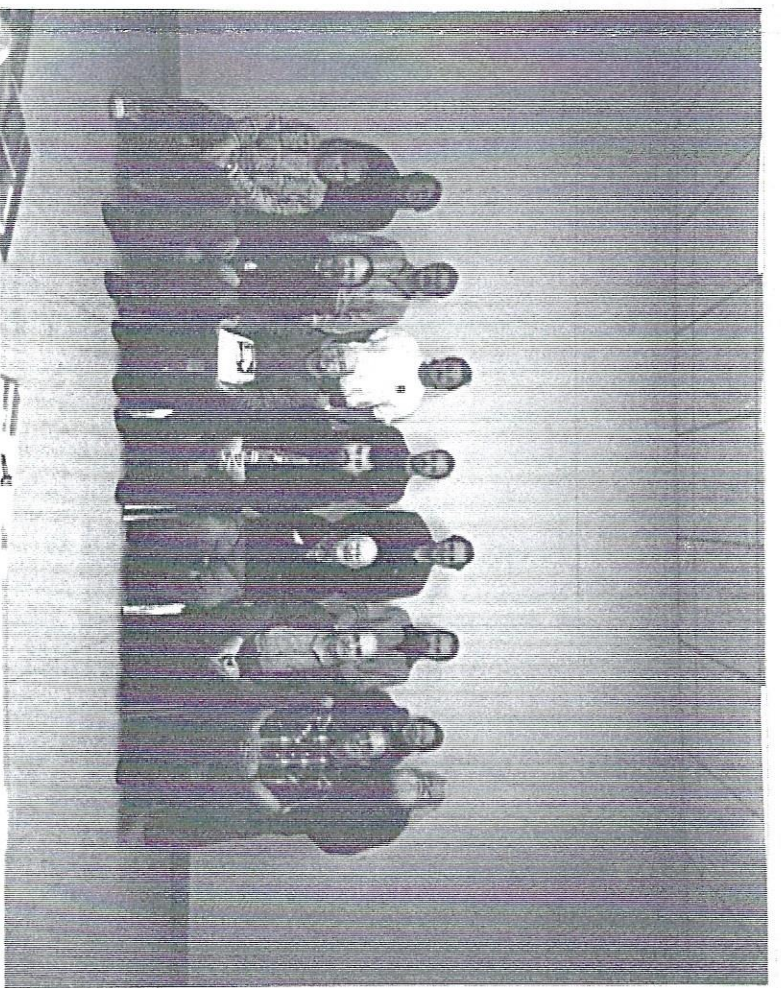

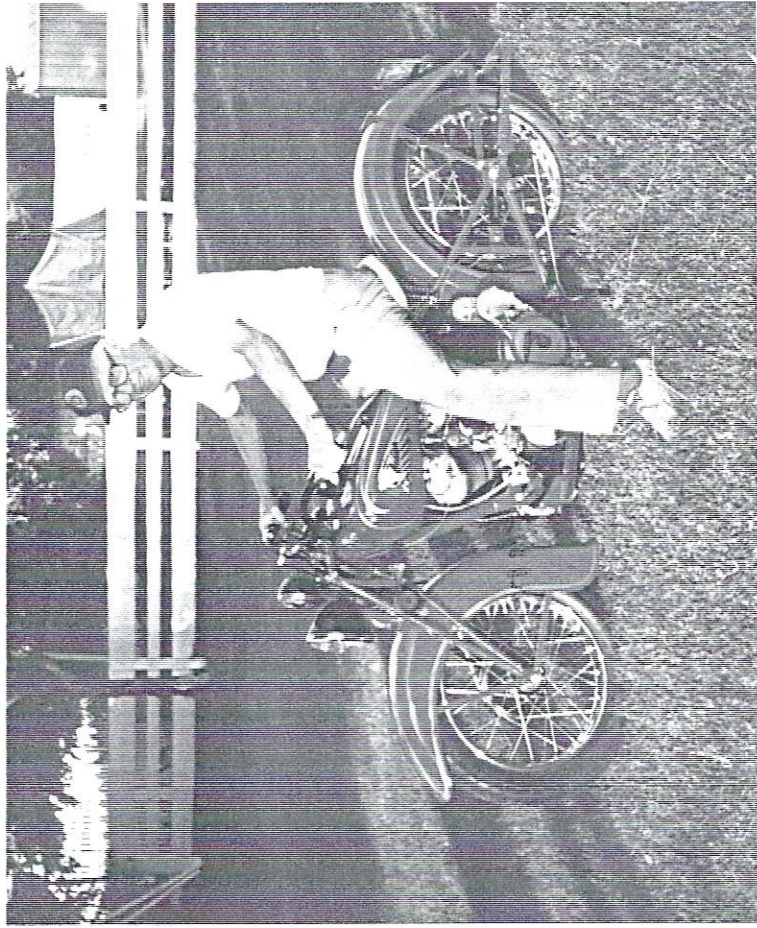


Above: President Jim,
