I couldn't find any bare wires or any other thing causing trouble. I finally left the right turn signal on and the flasher soon had a complete failure. Someone had replaced the original four prong flasher with a Triton three prong unit, the original had a separate ground terminal. I put in a new three prong one and it works fine. Would a four prong one blow the fuse if it failed?

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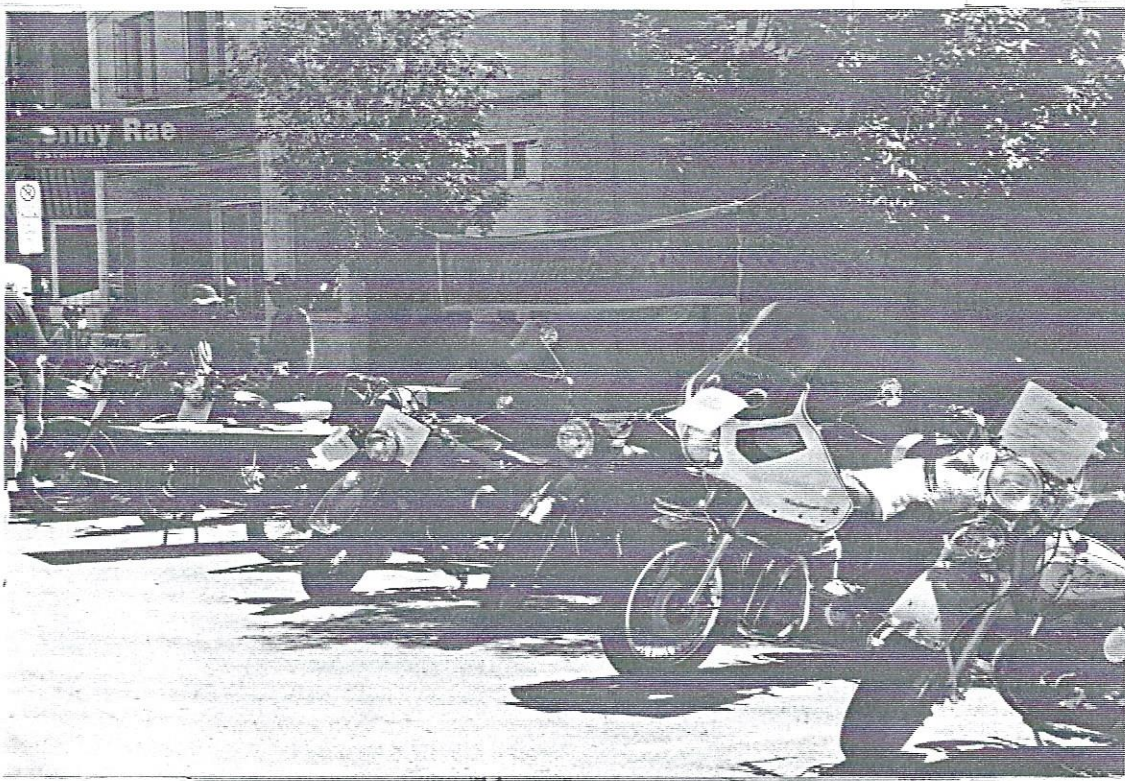
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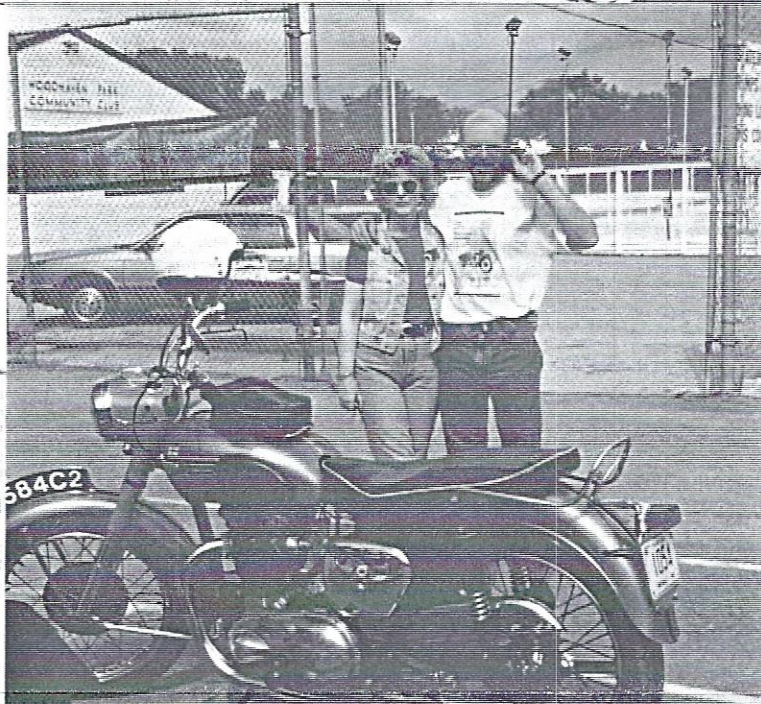

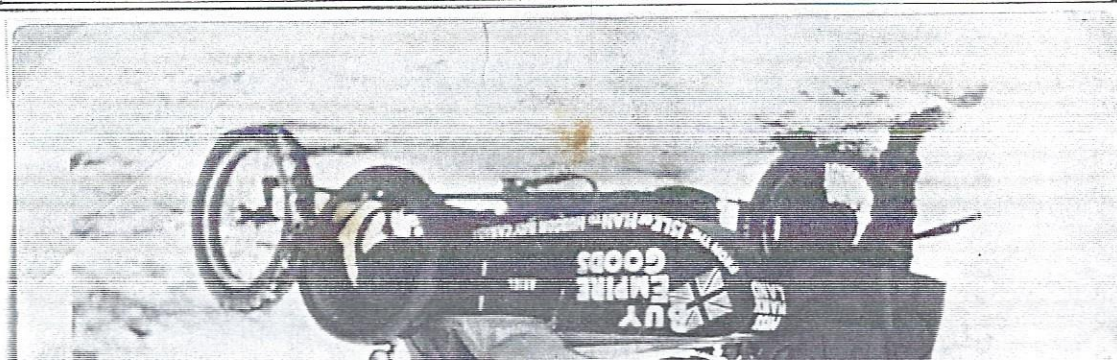
