

CVMG BOOK REPORT

"Riding the Continent"
by Hamilton Mack Laing (edited by Trevor Marc Hughes)
Ronsdale Press 2019



I recently went on a month-long cruise down the Amazon. I took along six month's worth of CVMG magazines. After I was done reading each one, I left them on the counter in the ship's library. A fellow traveller by the name of Gordon Apperley from BC tracked me down (apparently I am easy to identify since I wear an old motorcycle t-shirt every day) and asked "Are you the guy leaving the CVMG magazines in the library?". When I admitted that I was, he said I needed to read the book he had with him which had just been published.

Imagine my surprise when I cracked *Riding the Continent*, to find that it was about a guy from Winnipeg who rode across the US, coast-to-coast, in 1915 on a brand new Harley Davidson.

And halfway through the

adventure, his brother from Winnipeg joins him on a 1914 HD. Basically it is the 1915 diary of Hamilton Mack Laing, chronicling this journey 105 years ago.

"Hamilton Mack Laing was an illustrious early British Columbia writer and naturalist, but few know him as how he described himself in his mid-thirties: a motorcycle-naturalist. In 1915, he made one of the first transcontinental journeys, riding across the United States from Brooklyn to Oakland. His previously unpublished manuscript of this journey, hidden away for nearly a century, is available now for the first time.

Riding the Continent tells the story of a pioneering motorcyclist and independently thinking naturalist on a most unusual road trip. Laing's tale explores the beauty of North America's bird life, describes the sights, scenery and people he encountered, and takes us along for the ride on a 1915 Harley-Davidson he named Barking Betsy."

The writing is superb (my old Grade 8 Language Arts teacher would have approved). Here is a sample:

"I noted while passing a local agency handling the breed of machines to which Betsy claimed kindred I stopped and went in. There is a very pronounced fraternalism of gas machines. Many times on the Road I have noted it. A thousand miles from home a passing stranger gives me a wave and smile or hurrah simply because I happen to ride the same brand of machinery he does. A man seems to get attached to the mechanical clique in which he gyrates and to feel that all others are without the pale."

Included in the book are dozens of photographs, as well as a foreword by Laing biographer/B.C. historian Richard Mackie, and an afterword by editor/ motorcycle travel writer Trevor Marc Hughes.

Commendations about the book include:

"Laing's cross-country motorcycle journey in 1915 on Barking Betsy was a unique and exciting accomplishment in its day, and his remarkable journal from the ride is a fascinating read." (Mark Tuttle, Rider Magazine)

Whether you are Canadian (especially a Winnipegger) or from the USA, this is a must-read as Laing describes each and every day of his travels through the vast country of America. Thanks to my new B.C. friend Gordon for giving me something to pass the time while I am waiting for riding season to begin on the Prairies.


Prez. report continued

AMCM 2020 Pandemic Relay

Life here in Mexico. From Larry Woolley

This is just note to update everyone, that I am still alive... Surprise!

With the recent changes in airfare costs due to this virus I expect the flying prices to increase drastically, maybe two or three times higher than they were before. So this may make one think that driving may be more cost effective than flying.

We have had some deaths actually many locally. Due to the locals drinking bad moon shine. It was made from sugarcane, but turned into methyl alcohol added to a local drink mixed with fresh cow's milk. If the liquor stores were open everyone would still be alive. A group out of a place called Mazamitla made it the papers told us.

The lake area is opening up, restaurants are serving again, but in more open areas. The golf courses are open too. The main highway from the city to the lake still has security restricting non-residents back to the city, however business workers are allowed thru. They operate from 9 am to 12 pm, the Police and firefighters take turns.

Barber shops are open finally but movie theaters are still closed.

The US is building more wall length every day. Gas has dropped to \$1CDN per liter over all the country, which is a good thing.

I have about 3 more weeks of HOT dry weather before the rains arrive. 32 to 34 C highs, lows of 14 to 18C at night, at least the humidity is low under 30% now.

We are getting cherries on the market as well as the regulars of blue berries, straw berries grapes and tomatoes.

Well that is life here now, thought you'd like to know.

We have a Hard Luck Trophy.....






