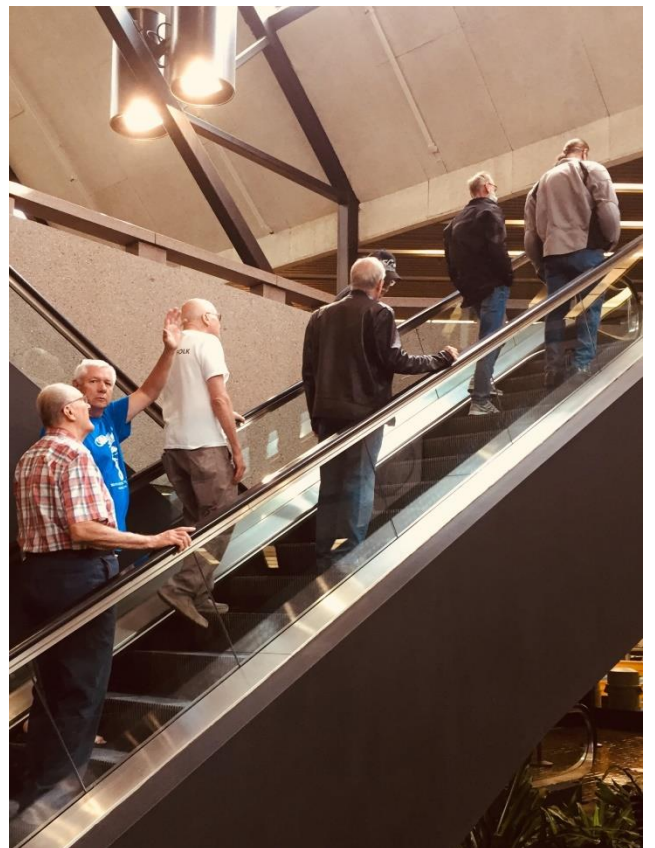

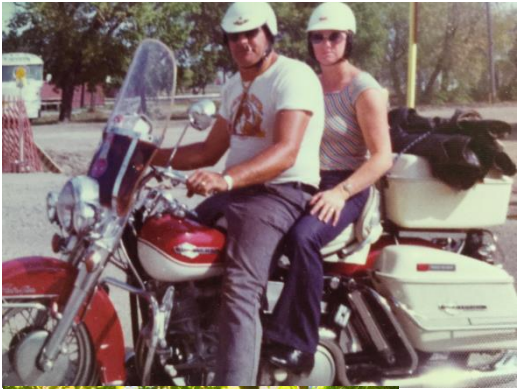

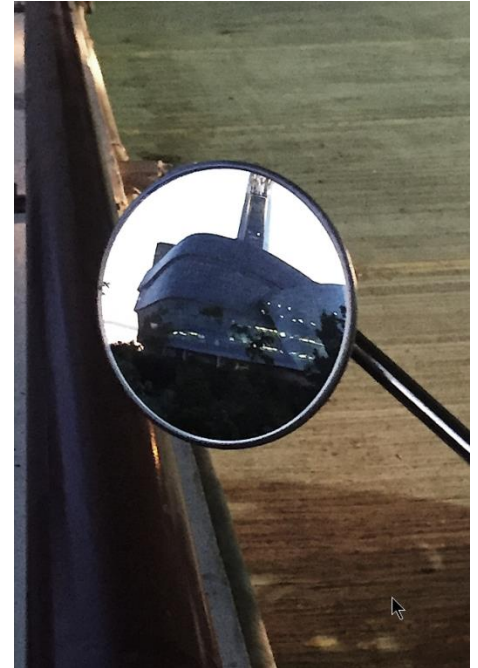


This is a picture of me with my friend Cory's puppy dog. Cory got this dog just when the Corona virus social distancing & lockdown occurred this past spring.

Here is some good news

Last month the Stonewall Motocross Club was formed with the mission "to establish and operate a Nationals quality motocross track in the Stonewall area while promoting the sport of motocross to riders of all ages and abilities with an emphasis on safety, and responsible riding".

We have identified some land on Hwy 7 that we think would work. We have had a track builder out to look at the land and give us an idea of what the cost would be. We are putting together our business plan and we believe that we can make this happen and have a track ready for the spring of 2021.

If you are not familiar with the sport of motocross there are a couple of groups active in Manitoba. 204 Grassroots Motocross, runs a competitive race series, and Manitoba Old Timers Motocross, runs a number of family oriented, non-competitive events. Both groups spread their events among tracks located around the province. Motocross tracks typically offer practice days / evening for local riders providing an opportunity to ride and learn from other riders. Overall the sport is a family friendly sport that brings together riders of all ages and all abilities.

The track we hope to build would be open once or twice a week for practices, April – October, with some weekend events over the summer months. We would offer learn to ride clinics for beginners and we would hopefully be on the race circuit within 2 years. The track will be designed for all ages / all abilities but with the ability to be “amped” up for more competitive events. The track will bring in riders from across the province and so even though our focus is to build a track, the economic spin offs for the community would be great. Riders need fuel, groceries and it will be a treat for them to have multiple restaurants so close by!

So now we're at the point of we know what we want but how do we pay for it? The project will cost about \$250,000 and we're hoping that with grants, a bit of fundraising and support from the Town of Stonewall and the RM of Rockwood we'll get the project done. This is where we need your help. If you think a motocross track is a good thing for the community, we need you to sign up to be a member of the club! You don't need to be a rider, you just need to believe that another recreational option in the community is a good thing. There is a nominal fee of \$5.00. This money won't amount to much, it will help pay a few small start-up costs but the membership numbers are what we really need! Membership numbers will help us show potential funders that the track is needed and that there is support for the project, and that is invaluable!

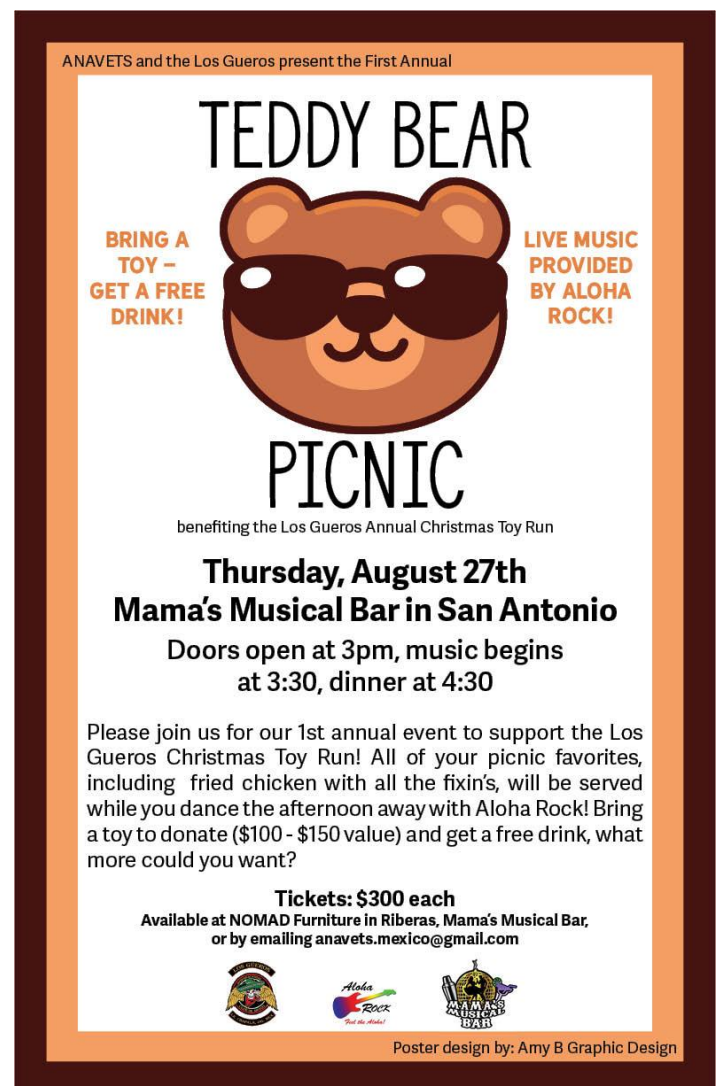

ANAVETS Mexico

We are in the rainy season, NOT summer but rainy weather generally after 4 pm to 10 am. The rains can happen anytime of the day but generally in evenings. This Will go on till the end of September, to slowly end by the end of November.

The Daytime Temp hovers around 26C with lows close to a chilly 16C. If one rides bikes as we do here, we take our rain gear with us, for just in case it is needed. We also take our face mask and hand sanitizer in case we have to stop for food. One can't get into any facility without a face mask, even though they may not work they still must be worn.

The beach resorts are slowly opening but with limited vacancy.

The grocery stores such as a big local one called Soriana, have security guards who spray the cart handles then wipe them for you. The store has two controlled entrances. One's Called, entrada the other is called Salida, with guards on each one to make sure you go the proper direction. All The Checkout Cashiers have plastic face masks and proper masks under them.

The Borders Are Still Closed up north I hear. The virus here is very low to nonexistent.

I took my van in for new front tires as the original rubber was worn too low seeing how it can't go north to be sold now. I will try to have it nationalized to get registered for a Mexican plate, then I can trade it for a NEW pickup with an automatic transmission, at least that is the plan now. The VW bug thing was not such a good idea after all.

The bike is running well when I can ride it, as I do LOVE the roads in the mountains. The speed limits are suggested limits as the police have NO radar outside of the cities in Mexico! 110 kph means 120 and up is okay if you want. 30 kph means 80 for bikes and cars is okay too, IF the road is open. Most cars do not signal so it gives me the homey feeling! So That is life here, another report next month or whenever.

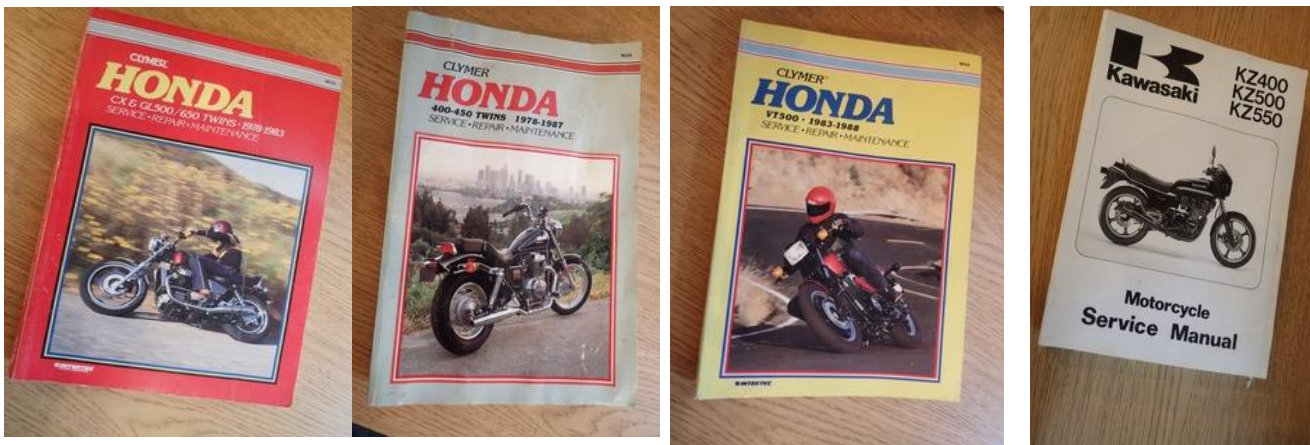
