Women are Changing the Motorcycling Landscape by Carolyn Peters, Manitoba

I have been frequently asked: How did you become a motorcyclist? The enquirer often has a puzzled look on their face which if expressed in words translates to: you just don't strike me as the motorcycling type. Well women are entering the motorcycling industry at the greatest pace of any demographic at the moment! The reasons are as diverse as the women themselves, however many say that it is about the freedom, the sense of independence, they were told they would never learn and so they were determined to prove they could, or perhaps they had always wanted to ride a bike!

I learned how to ride on the farm in rural Manitoba. It was largely a practical skill because an extra small bike or two on the farm meant that anyone could hop on and go deliver a message, lunch or coffee to the 'back 40' where our dad was cultivating a field and one did not always need an extra pickup truck or to walk the distance. The 1960's era Honda 90 was my first bike so I had to learn to shift and we made paths in the ditches or on the fields to ride in the evenings for fun after the chores and other farm work was done. My cousins and I had hours of fun riding and I loved it more than almost anything! I recently purchased a 1962 Honda 50 to rebuild as a nostalgic project. My husband and I belong to the Antique Motorcycle Club of Manitoba. We enjoy the people and the fix up projects of course.

My brother was the first one to get a motorcycle for leisure riding on summer trips. This went a bit counter to the farm lifestyle because summertime is busy season on the farm and most farmers do not take summer vacations. However, my older brother also loved riding more than almost anything. I remember the smell of the freshly cut grass and smoke from a bonfire I rode on the back of his bike in the evening just before sunset.

It was not until I had my own career, money and life that it occurred to me that I too could get my license and buy a motorcycle for leisure. Even then, one of the male instructors said: I had you pegged as one of the people who wouldn't get the hang of riding a motorcycle but you surprised me. REALLY I thought!? Well whatever stereotype he had in mind turns into the comments that women have experienced and described many times.

Gradually the landscape is changing and there are more women in leadership in motorcycling including industry, organized associations, training and riding

groups. In the last 5 years, I have had the opportunity to be serve on the provincial Board of Directors for the CMMG (Coalition of Manitoba Motorcycle Groups) and learned from the best about lobbying for the rights of motorcyclists and understanding how legislation can impact the safety and wellbeing of travel on a motorcycle. Recently, motorcyclists would not have been eligible for the two insurance rebates in Manitoba without the CMMG lobby. In addition, the insurance rates would have been twice as high without the CMMG engaging a lawyer to represent all Manitoba motorcyclists at the Public Utilities Board (PUB) hearings where the PUB agreed that motorcyclists had been unfairly targeted with the only large increase while all other classes of vehicle were decreasing their rates. CMMG also promotes safety, information and resources to motorcyclists across the province. As a Coalition of numerous motorcycle groups, this is the organization that is consulted about proposed legislation that could impact motorcyclists. CMMG also publicly promotes 'May is Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month' and this year the safety message is: Watch Out for each other!

I have had the privilege of representing Manitoba by serving at the national level on the Motorcycling Confederation of Canada (MCC) Board of Directors. As part of the MCC Road Riders Council, we are working on collating information about continuous skill improvement opportunities from across Canada with the belief that advanced training prevents accidents and injury, keeping riders and others road users safer.

The MCC has also been actively engaging with the international motorcycling community through multiple collaborations. FIM (Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme) is an international organization that brings riders from all regions and types of riding together. FIM Beyond Sport is the on road, off road and adventure riding side of the sport. This includes priorities like international tourism resources, support for continuous skill development and engagement in the sheer enjoyment of whatever type of riding matters to you.

I am thrilled that my daughter and her women friends are becoming motorcyclists as they are joining the growing demographic of women riders. Additional work is still needed to decrease discrimination and increase access for other populations. Manitoba is growing in its inclusivity in motorcycling. The Moto Social gatherings throughout Winnipeg welcomed more than 300 different types of motorcyclists and were a good example of inclusiveness prior to the pandemic in Winnipeg. Currently The Moto Social is an on-line event giving everyone the opportunity to chat with riders from all over North America. Even during the pandemic, motorcycling interest is growing! While we wait for the community to be safe to gather again, stay safe, and ride within the provincially recommended guidelines.

Bison Rally Plan "B"

We are unable to hold our three-day rally complete with all our events and food, but we can still ride out to Cartier Park! We will be holding a Bison Rally poker run on Saturday August 7th - best five card poker hand. One **free** poker hand for anybody that shows up wearing their 2020 or 2021 Bison Rally shirt. The club will kick in \$100.00 cash and a few donated prizes to make it worthwhile. Additional poker hands can be purchased for \$5.00 each or three for \$10.00. All money collected will be added to the prize pool. There will be prizes for best hand & worst hand so expect more than one winner!

2021 Bison Rally Poker Run Saturday August 7th at 10:30-11:00



We meet at the Trappist Monastery Provincial Heritage park in St. Norbert. You can find Ross and sign up for a poker hand at any of the stops we make. There is no deadline or rush to buy a hand. Just don't all leave it to the last stop unless you enjoy standing in line.

We ride south on Pembina highway turning left on Turnbull drive stopping at St Norbert Heritage Park.





Heading South on Turnbull drive make a left turn cross the Floodway gates and turn right on St Mary's road. Turn right at the St Agathe turn off, cross the river, and turn left into town.

Next stop, St Agathe steam engine located on main road through town across from the Co-op.

From the steam engine we go back towards the bridge, turn west, carefully cross the busy four lane Highway, and pull into Cartier Park.



We'll sort out the poker hands, have a snack, and hang out for a while. Then we can leave at our own speed. Members from Morden, Winkler, and Carman area are welcome to arrange their own best route and still play a hand of poker when they arrive or ride in and join us at the start.





The distance from St Norbert to Cartier park is 34 km. Round trip for me from home will be 150 km, It's a nice easy distance on a vintage bike. But, if that's not enough road for you to chew on, our new treasurer Della Beattie will share with you a 1964 MMC TT road ride that touches on three hill climb sites from back in the day. The first two riders to complete that ride will each receive a 2021 Rally shirt when we meet up in Cartier Park, St Agathe between 12:00 and 1:00 Saturday August 7th.


The CMMG attend Public Utility Board hearings. They present sound arguments and evidence for fair motorcycle insurance rates for all Manitobans.

Joe Sawtus 2021 Mileage Challenge

To participate you must be a member of the AMCM in good standing and listed in the 2021 AMCM Printed directory. New members that join to late to be included on the roster can take part next year.

At the start of your 2021 riding season record the odometer readings on the vintage motorcycles you intend to ride this year. Take a digital photo of your odometer, store as an email which could also include a picture of the motorcycle as well.

Prior to the October meeting record your odometer reading and calculate the miles ridden on your vintage bike(s) for the 2021 season. Each motorcycle gets a mileage boost which depends on its age.

AMCM member with the "Highest Mileage points" wins a Trophy and a nice cash Prize!


We would encourage all members to maintain an up to date photo of all your bikes. Get them on the road or on display. Drive safely, promote the sport and enjoy.

Joe Sawtus 2021 Mileage challenge

Remember to record your Odometer reading at the start of the 2021 season. The easiest way to record your mileage is with a cell phone photo. One at the start, no earlier than March 29 meeting and a second one at the finish no later than our October 26th meeting.

To be a winner you will need to have recorded your mileage

Year and make of bike Odometer Start Odometer finish Difference X Mileage multiplier = Total



Ted and Gary's 2021 Bonneville Salt Racer Update

Here are some pictures of the re-invented flathead racer.

Body-work is all aluminum, and very light! Visible on this side are the exhaust ports along the bottom, one of the carb velocity stacks further forward, and just above it the port for the supercharger blow-off valve.





The beaker-shaped NACA duct beside the front wheel pulls cooling air in toward the engine with minimum disruption to the airflow along the side.

The kick-starter fits into its own streamlined "shoe". It's a rocket-ship with a kick-starter! Hah!

On the left side, only the clutch "derby" cover and velocity stack are in the airflow.

Long airflow-controlling surfaces extend well beyond the rider.



Same old flathead mill, now plumbed to a 500cc blower. Red anodized blow-off valve is visible on the front intake pipe.

All fuel lines are wrapped in a fire-retardant "fire sleeve".





Fuel from the tank under the seat is pressurized by two Yamaha Road Star fuel pumps (just barely visible at the cylinder bases).

The blower is driven off an extra sprocket on the engine output shaft.



Dash panel is very "Buck Rogers". There are switches for the main power, and individual fuel pumps as well as gauges for boost, airfuel ratio, and cylinder head temperature.

The louvered panel avoids frying the dualplug splitters housed underneath.

The black button to the aft of the louvers is an emergency ignition shut-off.

This cool light is bottom center on the dash panel. WARNING! FLATHEAD REACTOR CORE ENGAGED!




